

EBM Transfers

Scenario

Any time EBM is removed from a storage location, you must use the **Transfer Milk** process found on the handheld device.

You have logged into the handheld device.

Instruction



- 1. Open the option menu.
- 2. Select the **Transfer Milk** option.

- Scan the batch to be transferred. Note, you can scan multiple batches and they will populate the transfer list.
- 4. Press **Transfer** to commit process.
- You should receive a confirmation message (not shown here). Press OK. If not, the server did not receive the data and you must perform Transfer process again.

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 At this point the transferred milk is available on the transport screen ready to be stored, prepared, and/or administered.

Transfer tells the system you are taking milk out of a fridge/freezer, starts the 4 hour expiry window countdown and places milk in transport screen on handheld.

Further information

Transfer Milk puts EBM into "transport" so it will display in the transport window.



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What is transport?

Any time EBM is not in storage or being administered, it is said to be in "transport". EBM is allowed to be in transport for 4 hours, after which time the EBM will expire and become unusable.

Collection and preparation will automatically put EBM into "transport"; however, transport is only activated upon removal from a fridge or freezer by using "Transfer Milk" process.

If you do not "Transfer Milk" when removing from fridge/freezer, the system does not know so the EBM will not be in transport and the 4 hour safety mechanism will not be activated!



L798 has been collected and now appears in transport window. Refer to batch enclosed by red box in image to left:

represents "home label" collection.
Line 1: batch number, quantity collected
Line 2: Baby's first name and surname.
Line 3: date (day/month/year) and time collected.

The coloured circle on the right indicates quality status. Refer to chart below.

Milk that can be administered
Milk that is reaching its expiry date and time. Requires approval when used for administration
Expired milk
Milk in transit. Milk that has been transferred for administration, or to be stored in a different fridge/freezer
Milk not available
